Bible written to be understandable by the 5 senses of man
 &
 Mans knowledge and experience
 God is beyond mans 5 senses & experience therefore belief is required
 Note: Common man could NOT read in biblical times

Originally thought the Bible's theme could be summarized as forgiveness.

God's forgiveness of man by sending his Son to die on the cross to forgive the sins of mankind.

Does God predetermine our lives?

The pure academic answer is NO. Why is the answer no?

- God created the physical world with absolutely static predetermined rules. However,
- God created each man with a soul which can exercise the freedom of choice
 - This freedom of choice for each individual man is non-deterministic¹
 - The PARADOX present here is
 - Although God does NOT know each man's actions
 - God knows that mankind as a whole will succumb to
 - pleasure and laziness
 - And thus God can predict/prophesize in Revelations

Does God change his mind?

- An computer analogy is
 - God is the ultimate quantum computer who knows all possibilities
 - God creates a (baseline) initial data set of
 - Chosen people the Jews
 - entries in the Book of Life²
 - And dynamically
 - grafts the Gentiles onto the Tree of Life
 - trims the dead branches

God neither changes his mind or predetermines a man's destiny.

New Christian Testament writers

- Interestingly
 - 13³ of the 27 books are written by Paul/Saul
 - Paul is not one of the 12 Apostles that traveled with Christ
 - Luke one of the twelve travels with Paul to testify to his title as an apostle
 - ...
 - As Saul a devout Jewish Pharisee he persecuted Christians
 - On the road to Damascus he is struck down by Jesus
 - Jesus asks 'Saul. Why do you persecute me?'
 - Jesus shares with Saul the new Christian covenant
 - Saul becomes Paul
 - becomes an avid Christian and apostle
 - as a Jewish Pharisee becomes the perfect translator to the Jewish nation of this New Convenient thru Hebrews
 - also becomes the perfect translator for the Gentiles describing this New Convenient thru Romans

Evil 1st appears in heaven

- God, the Son and the Holy Spirit are the Alpha and the Omega

- Conecption w/in the Virgin Mary
 - God directly created Jesus's conception cell bypassing the insemination phase
 - Mary was Jesus's physical mother from that point on
 - Another words Jesus's DNA Helix halves were both perfect and directly created by God
 - If the Shroud of Turin is every DNA analized it will clearly have DNA defects
 - God's Word is based on belief and NOT what may appear to be fact
